The Youth and kids will be following along with their own guides, which emphasize that the church is a place where we can feel safe sharing our thoughts and feelings.

When I first spoke to the Youth group about this, they expressed relief. "Sometimes it feels like there's always adults trying to tell us it's not a big deal whatever we're going through," one told me, saying they were glad to have adults they can rely on at our church. The author, Junius B. Dotson, hopes that the church can be a place where we find, "grace, encouragement, and authentic community" through the spiritual practices outlined in the text.

I'm proud that our young people have committed to covenant discipleship for the past two years. I've watched them grow in their ability to listen to and support one another.

We will be offering Wednesday night activities from 5:30-6:30 for parents, youth, and children soon (start date to be announced)! Parents are invited to pick up a copy of Love-Centered Parenting for \$15 in the office and take part in our book study while the Youth and kids enjoy games and snacks.

In doing some prep work for the upcoming sermon series Soul Reset I came across this story and video.

Rabbi David Wolpe of Los Angeles' Sinai Temple, in a Moments of Connection video posted on April 9, 2021(https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=EHQHtYfvbbg), points out that the Hebrew expression for synagogue, beit knesset, means "house of gathering," not "house of prayer."

He goes on to tell an old joke, about Schwartz and Goldberg, who walk into the synagogue one day. "What are you doing here, Goldberg?" someone asks. "I understand why Schwartz is here. He's religious. But Goldberg, you're not!"

Schwartz speaks up on behalf of his friend. "Let me explain. I come here to talk to God. But Goldberg comes to talk with me."

<u>COVID update:</u> We are keeping an eye on the recent COVID surge and our ministry leaders are doing what is best for their ministries to keep people safe. 2021 Apportionments Update: We were able to pay 100% of our Green Country District Apportionments. We paid \$15,073 out of the \$31,685 of the Conference's Apportionments. We were able to fulfill our Stared Apportionments which are required by the Current 2016 United Methodist Book of Discipline. We were able to 100% of the Mission and Ministry Apportionments. We made a great push at the end of the year but the large Utility bill we were hit with along with our Roof Repairs hampered our ability to pay out completely in full. On Whom Will You Put Your Faith In This Coming Year?

"And Joshua said unto all the people [of Israel],.... choose you this day whom you will serve;... but as for me and my house, we will serve the Lord." (Joshua 24:2,15)

I read this great story the other day about these Indians on a remote reservation in South Dakota. It was late fall and they had asked their new chief if the coming winter was going to be cold or mild. Since he was a chief in a modern society, he had never been taught the old secrets. When he looked at the sky, he couldn't tell what the winter was going to be like.

Nevertheless, to be on the safe side, he told his tribe that winter was indeed going to be cold and that the members of the village should collect firewood to be prepared. But, being a practical leader, after several days he got an idea. He made a phone call to the National Weather Service and asked, "Is the coming winter going to be cold?" "It looks like this winter is going to be quite cold", the meteorologist at the weather service responded.

The chief went back to his people and told them to collect even more firewood in order to be prepared. A week later, he called the National Weather Service again, "Does it still look like it is going to be a very cold winter?" "Yes," the man at the National Weather Service again replied, "It's going to be a very cold winter."

The chief again went back to his people and ordered them to collect every scrap of firewood they could find. Two weeks later, the chief called the National Weather Service again. "Are you absolutely sure that the winter is going to be very cold?" "Absolutely," the man replied. "It's looking more and more like it is going to be one of the coldest winters we've ever seen." "How can you be so sure?" the chief asked. The weatherman replied, "The Indians are collecting a load of firewood.

Now, while that's a cute story and probably tells you more truth about the weather service than you want to know, there's a real lesson here to ask as you move into a new year.

In the coming year, just who or what are you going to put your faith in for leading and advice? Who will you serve? Where will you place your trust? What do you consider to be your sources of wisdom? I challenge you to focus on the questions above and answer them with true sincerity. If you get advice from the right places, serve the right leading, place your trust in the right source and get your wisdom from the right places, the day to day decisions will take care of themselves.

Joshua challenged his people to choose who they would serve but said that for him and for his house, they would serve the Lord. So many people today place their trust in wisdom, but I believe Psalm 20:7 explains it best, "Some trust in chariots and some in horses, but we trust in the name of the Lord our God." In this coming year, I pray that we all do nothing less.


